## Poplar and Beech Class OAE Music Concert at Corn Exchange Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2017

In the evening, 32 children from our school came back to perform again, to a sold out audience watching (and participating) in the concert. After James (the conductor) had taught the audience some of our songs and actions the children loved watching the audience join in...the children thought it sounded 'spine-tingling' when we all sang together!
