Dear Parents/Carers,

What a productive week we have had this week! The children have worked hard throughout the week and shown what mature learners they can be.

In our maths this week, Oak Class have focused on place value. The children have looked at numbers up to ten million and confidently read and written numbers using their understanding of what each digit represents. We have also spent time unitising by considering how many ten thousands are in 7 digit numbers or hundred thousands for example. This was something which we found tricky at first, but after lots of discussion, it is starting to become a little clearer.

Oak Class are focusing on Wishing Stories in English this half term and have spent time learning 'The King of the Fishes' this week. As always, we started by creating a story map and adding actions to help us learn the story by heart. On Wednesday, our focus turned to comprehension, which included time to recap the VIPERS and how they can be used to aid answering questions about a text.

Reading Plus

Children all have access to Reading Plus. We do not have as much time in school to access this in Year 6 due to a tighter schedule to cover the curriculum, but the expectation remains that children will complete 5 lessons a week. Therefore, we kindly ask that they complete 3 lessons at home a week. This may be in place of reading their book.

All children should have taken a school reading book home, which is to remain at home until it has been completed. At this point, children are to return their book to school and exchange it for another book to be read at home. Could all Reading Records please be brought into school every Friday so that it can be updated and to see how they are getting on with their reading at home.
