Dear Rowan parents and carers,

This week in Rowan Class we took pictures and words from the Leafman story and worked as a team to put these in the order that they happen in the book. We also reminded ourselves what a setting is and wrote short descriptions using interesting adjectives.

In Maths we have continued with our work on Place Value. We have used the Dienes to make numbers between 40 and 100 as well as counting objects within 100. We have learnt that these numbers are made from tens and ones and we can compare these numbers by seeing how many tens are in each.

In Science this week we discussed what we need to survive and the difference between things that our bodies need and things that we just feel like we want. We then looked at what mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds and fish need to survive. We discovered that these 'needs' can vary depending on the type of animal.

We planned routes through the village this week using real maps of the village. We each chose a start point and an end point and worked out what would be the quickest route between the two. We discovered that some routes can only be completed by walking, like when you cut through a park, and other routes are only safely completed in a vehicle, like when we go along the A10 to Kings Lynn.

In Art this week we went out to collect materials to build our very own bird nests. We used twigs and leaves to make structures that would be deep enough to hold bird eggs but wide enough so that the mother could sit on the eggs to keep them warm-we learnt that this is called 'incubation' and without it the baby birds in the eggs won't grow.
